

## Requirements to Vote

You must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old or will be at the time of the next election, resided at your residential address for at least 28 consecutive days immediately preceding the upcoming election, and have not otherwise been disqualified from voting.

To vote, you must be registered in the Town of Menasha at your current address. If you moved or changed your name, you must re-register.

All voters will be asked to show a [Photo ID](#) whether in-person or at the polls before being issued a ballot. The link will take you to the State of Wisconsin website for more information on the Photo ID law now in place. The Photo ID need **not** contain a current address to be acceptable for voting.

## Voting on Election Day

The voter will announce their name and address. An election inspector will ask you to show your [Photo ID](#) from a list of documents that constitute acceptable Photo ID.

Once verified that the name on the ID conforms to the name on the poll list, and verifies that the photo reasonably resembles the voter, a signature will be obtained by the voter on **one** Poll List. (If prevented from signing due to disability, you are exempt). A voter number and ballot are then issued.

Voters may cast a provisional ballot on Election Day and have until **4 pm the Friday after the election** to provide the required documentation to the Clerk. Your ballot may then be counted.
